### Driving from Kaffee Klatsch via Appia to Wehrkunde



This February has witnessed several highlevel global meetings that are already shaping policy debates. Even though the World Economic Forum "Collaboration for the Intelligent Age" concluded in the month of January, there were several initiatives and work focused on sustainable growth and innovation to tackle global inequality and climate change with the current geopolitics. In Geneva, the WHO Executive Board met from February 4 to 11, with the Programme Budget Advisory Committee playing a key role in linking strategic decisions to the upcoming World Health Assembly to secure flexible funding for emerging health threats and the exit of two PAHOs members USA and Argentina. Meanwhile, from February 14 to 16 in Munich, over 60 heads of state, ministers, and senior officials gathered at the 61st Munich Security Conference to discuss enhancing European defense, preserving Ukrainian sovereignty, and adapting transatlantic partnerships amid a shifting change in global order.



The Health Diplomacy Alliance (HDA) is honored to be a co-author of *Humanitarian Action in the Planetary Crisis.* A pivotal paper addressing the intersection of global health, environmental crisis, and escalating humanitarian needs. Our Executive Director, Katherine Urbáez served as a lead co-author, together with **Valeria Marino**, **Isabelle Bolon**, **Davide Ziveri**, **Jakob Zinsstag**, **Karl Blanchet**, **Rafael Ruiz de Castañeda**, contributing alongside a team of top academics and humanitarian experts.

As climatic disasters and environmental degradation worsen, disadvantaged groups confront increased health risks, including food insecurity, displacement, and disease. This report defies conventional wisdom by proposing health diplomacy as a key component of crisis response. We propose transformative routes to protect human and planetary health by combining environmental stewardship, equity-centered policy, and cross-border collaboration.

The report also underlines that creating systemic resilience necessitates reframing aid via a health-focused lens, with a focus on prevention and long-term adaptation. It identifies chances to bridge humanitarian and environmental goals, ensuring that vulnerable groups are not left behind, through extensive case studies and strong policy frameworks. As co-authors, HDA emphasizes the importance of global health partnerships in facilitating this crucial transformation.
